The orientation residence (2 Credits)

The intention behind the orientation residence is to meet the students, and introduce key members of Faculty to them. We will also orient the students to the programme, and ensure they have access to the on-line platform, and the study skills that they will need to perform well. The first on-line module will be opened whilst they are in residence, and we will be able to ensure that the students are capable and confident in using the platform.

The online component (19 Credits)

The online modules are provided by FAIMER and CenMEDIC on a platform managed by CenMEDIC. The modules are comprised of units. Each of the units has been written by an acknowledged international expert in the field. The 25 units to be included in the course are shown below with their codes and dates. These units are equivalent to 375 hours of study that is delivered over 25 weeks, plus assignments and assessments which take a further 13 weeks (195 hours). The on-line component therefore takes 38 weeks (570 hours) to complete, as follows:

The research component (12 Credits)

Students must successfully complete the on-line component and the residential component before they can embark upon the research component. The research component comprises a supervised research project, focussed on an issue of importance to the student and their home institution. The student and their project will be supervised by an experienced researcher from the GMU. The GMU will appoint a local supervisor for those students who come from other institutions and will visit their institution to ensure that there are adequate arrangements to ensure that the student can complete the project within the allocated time.
