GMU's Collaboration with Quality Assurance Agency (QAA), UK's independent quality body and a global leader in quality assurance for higher education



GMU's contribution to UAE Higher education goals

Prof. Hossam Hamdy chaired the session on Research cooperation opportunities with local and foreign entities during a forum on the UAE's Strategic Directions in the Health and Medical Research Sector organized by the National Health Research Center (NCHR), Emirates Health Services organized (Link, Link) in November 2021.

GMU's contribution to MoH goals to strengthen the health workforce of UAE

GMU's Chancellor Prof. Hossam Hamdy was invited to the Strategic Planning Meeting organized by Ministry of Health & Prevention. This was the first meeting of the committee to strengthen the qualified health workforce in various health specialties (Link)

GMU, the only university in UAE that is represented in the ACPE international commission.

Prof. Sherief Khalifa is a member of ACPE international commission. He serves as "commissioner elect" and is part of the mission of ACPE International Services Program is to promote, assure, and advance the quality of pharmacy education internationally to improve patient care through safe and effective medication use (Link).

GMU's collaborations for Research

GMU's Vice Chancellor Research Prof. Salem Chouaib is a member of the Scientific committee of Emirates cancer research center and has been ranked #2 in the United Arab Emirates as well as



#10960 in the world ranking (H-index 77) (Link) and is working with other members of the committee including scientists from other HEIs and experts from health ministries of UAE towards extending research collaborations between researchers in specialized medical research fields in UAE, enhancing published research indicators that feed national competitive innovation, identify national health & medical research capabilities, etc.

Strategic international partnerships of GMU to achieve the SDGs

GMU's contribution to the Development of the UAE Competency and Professional Practice Framework.

The development of the framework, as part of the UAE MOE call for nursing education reform, was supported by the Nursing Department at the Ministry of Health and Prevention (MOHAP), accelerated by the global pandemic, and a national collaboration of expert nursing academic leaders including Gulf Medical University. College of Nursing, Prof. Selva Titus Chacko has actively contributed in the Development of the UAE Competency and Professional Practice Framework (<u>Link</u>). Service representatives of the three leading UAE healthcare service providers, including MOHAP, DHA (Dubai Health Authority), and SEHA (Abu Dhabi Health Services, Co.), also contributed in further refining the Framework.

GMU collaborates with Emirates Health Services in their Preceptor Development Program for Nurses

The College of Nursing at the Gulf Medical University, in cooperation with the Emirates Health Services Corporation, has started an eight-week training program, every Friday and Saturday, from September 16 to November 12, 2022, for 250 nurses from the Foundation and Thumbay Hospitals. The training held at the university aims to guide newly qualified nurses at the hands of senior nurses, while they practice their profession in a distinguished manner in the clinical fields. Dr. Silva Titus Chaco, Dean of the College of Nursing, said: "We are grateful to the Foundation for Training and Development Center and Nursing Administration for giving us the opportunity to contribute to enhancing the skills and development of the nursing profession in the UAE." The first batch began on September 16, with fourteen sessions (Link)

The College of Pharmacy contributed to the 'Preceptorship Development Workshop'" organized by the College of Nursing Gulf Medical University & Emirates Health Services (EHS) Training and Development Centre (Link). Further, faculty from College of Medicine and College of Dentistry



contributes to this program.

GMU's Collaboration with Russian Government

Prof. Hossam was invited during May 2021 by the Moscow City Healthcare Department. Ministry of Health Russia to sign an MOU to promote academic and training exchange between the two institutions.




Figure 1: Sustainability indicators of GMU partnerships





Figure 2: At a glance - GMU collaborating institutions across the world




Figure 3: GMU Publications by Subject Area as of 06.10.2022

GMU's Collaboration for Advanced Simulation in Healthcare



The GMU Simulation Center offers Training Programs & RCPE Online Courses to doctors, nurses and other health professionals. CASH is an AHA-accredited life support training site which offers BLS & ACLS courses regularly as well NAEMT Accredited training Site which offers PHTLS. CASH officially declared as an international centre to run MRCPUK PACES examination twice annually. CASH is a member of simulation related professional bodies like SESAM, ASPE, ASSH, SSH.










GMU's Future Scientist Program
