


Graduates of Gulf Medical University






GMU has produced 2960-health professionals since its inception who are serving the healthcare sector locally as well as internationally.



GMU's stands 1st in UAE in Medical Education Research Publications

GMU is a known Center of Excellence in medical education in the region offering several faculty development training programs nationally, regionally, and internationally. Its faculty is active in medical education research having the highest number of publications in medical education in UAE (62% of the total publication from top universities in UAE from 2017 to 2022).

GMU is committed to continue support the MHPE program, advancing health professions education in the Middle East region and pursuing excellence in health profession education, research and practice. The program is in full alignment with the mission and vision of GMU. The MHPE program at GMU gained an excellent international reputation, having students from UAE, Bahrain, China, and Russia. The CAA-ERT has commented that GMU's master's in health progress program is "unique and engaging faculty from across the medical specialties and attracts students from different medical health professions". It has also indicated that "students are clearly benefiting from the expertise and experience of faculty in the field". GMU provides a variety of learning opportunities ranging from F2F teaching, LIVE synchronous and recorded webinars by experts and face-to-face teaching.

GMU received recognition by Ministry of interior, UAE for their contributions to the Waterfalls initiative



GMU College of Pharmacy team was recognized by H.H. Lt. Gen. Sheikh Saif bin Zayed al Nahyan for their contributions to the waterfall's initiative. GMU team had contributed exceptionally to the success of the global Waterfalls initiative and the delivery of its humanitarian message to the world. The aim of the initiative was to provide academic support and free specialized training through lectures and workshops. It is recorded that 1 million, 299 thousand and 667-healthcare specialists have benefited from this initiative which was presented by more than 353-specialists through 568 lectures.

The academic materials and content presented in the Waterfalls initiative were approved by 6 prestigious scientific institutions, with the participation of more than 41-international associations, societies, and academics. The initiative also took part in 17-specialized medical conferences and exhibitions around the world and included 15-biomedical sectors (Link).

I2C2". This is an annual multi-institutional event where students from different health professions work together virtually in small teams with learners across professions, institutions, and countries to compete in solving complex clinical cases over 5-weeks (<u>Link</u>)

GMU collaborates with Emirates Health Services in the Training & Development Program for Nurses

The College of Nursing at the Gulf Medical University, in cooperation with the Emirates Health Services Corporation, has started an eight-week training program, every Friday and Saturday, from September 16 to November 12, 2022, for 250-nurses from the Foundation and Thumbay Hospitals. The training held at the university aims to guide newly qualified nurses at the hands of senior nurses, while they practice their profession in a distinguished manner in the clinical fields. Dr. Silva Titus Chaco, Dean of the College of Nursing, said: "We are grateful to the Foundation for Training and Development Center and Nursing Administration for giving us the opportunity to contribute to enhancing the skills and development of the nursing profession in the UAE." 
GMU Celebrated Simulation Week




GMU's Contribution to Community

GMU's Annual Medical and Science Exhibition (MASE) 2022


GMU MASE 2022 had on display around 500-exhibits in the project, music, poetry, poster and painting categories by talented young students from across schools in the UAE.






GMU'S Community Engagement Activities

GMU'S Community Outreach Events at Schools

Health Promotion Program on Health of Adolescent Boys

As part of its community engagement activity event, Community Medicine Department of College of Medicine, Gulf Medical University in coordination with its strategic partner Thumbay University Hospital held this program at East Point Indian School, Ajman in June 2022, and deliberated all the health concerns the students would face as they grow and become

teenagers and young adults. The students seemed very curious and wanted to know more. It gave the children an opportunity to explore these sensitive topics with experts and



clarify any misconceptions.

Health Education On "Menstrual Cycle and Hygiene Management" o Adolescent School Girls

The objectives of this session were to alleviate the anxiety associated with it and to educate the school-going age girls about the importance of having healthy menstruation to address the challenges faced by them. Students of the MPH program with support from GMU, College of Medicine, Community Engagement Committee too had an interactive health education session with the enthusiastic girls. Around 250-students participated in the event.





GMU Students Volunteer for Thumbay Labs PCR Drive

Thumbay Labs organized a healthcare outreach campaign that aimed to conduct COVID-19 PCR tests to returning students and teachers in more than 180-schools all over the United Arab Emirates. More than 20-PharmD students across all years of GMU College of Pharmacy and 20+ from all other colleges of GMU volunteered this 3-days event.

Students were trained on how to conduct the PCR tests by the Thumbay Labs team and then assigned to schools all over UAE. At the schools they conducted more than 200 PCR tests every day over 14-hours shifts.







The Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences contributes to "GEMS-GMU Future Scientist of UAE Program 2022": Hands-on laboratory sessions on drug discovery and development research

The rotation began with an introductory session explaining the scope of pharmaceutical

sciences research in drug discovery. This was followed hands-on laboratory by sessions, where students synthesized medicinal agents from commercially available chemicals. Future scientist program is part of the GMU's outreach and impact on society. It is designed to provide





opportunities for the young minds of the UAE to discover their passion and abilities and help to guide these students a promising future in science, research, and service to their community.
